

Power of 10

What Is It?

- An approach to Council Management
- Divide your council into teams
 - 100 member council; 10 teams of 10 members
 - 50 member council; 10 teams of 5 members
 - Whatever works for your council
- Assign council officers and directors as team leaders
- Hold a “Draft” to select team members

How To Use It:

- Membership Growth
 - Assign each team a recruiting quota
 - Encourage competition between the teams
- Service Programs
 - Assign programs and projects to teams
 - ie. Two teams to each Lenten Fish Dinner
 - Tailor teams by interests
 - A youth team: Dads with young kids
 - A Church team: Older Brother who are in parish ministries

Retention

- Have the team leader call each member once a quarter or every other month
 - Keeps roster up to date and the council finds out about Brothers with problems
 - Makes members feel like they belong.
 - Keeps widows from getting “Knights Alerts”, etc
